On September 2, 2014, the City of Tehachapi met with representatives from the Tehachapi Unified School District to celebrate the new improvements to the intersection of Pinon Street and Curry Street, immediately adjacent to Tompkins Elementary. Using \$405,000 in grant funds from the very competitive Safe Routes to School program administered by Caltrans, the City of Tehachapi constructed new sidewalks, curb and gutter, and new decorative crosswalks at the intersection to make it safer for children walking or riding a bike to school.



“Creating safer crosswalks, accessible ramps, and eliminating gaps in the sidewalk network should make walking and biking to school more attractive to students and parents” said Phil Smith, Mayor of the City. “In addition to the added safety benefits, we’re excited about bringing more of our tax dollars back to this community so that they don’t get spent somewhere else in the State.”




